# ARE SUMMER CLASSES RIGHT FOR YOU?



## BEFORE TAKING SUMMER CLASSES, TAKE INTO CONSIDERATION:

### Your Study Habits

Summer classes are more accelerated and therefore require a significant time commitment in order to be successful. If you tend to struggle with time management or have difficulty staying on top of schoolwork, a summer class is not recommended.

### Your Financial Aid Eligibility

While financial aid can be used to pay for summer courses, there are restrictions. Some forms of financial aid require you to be enrolled for a certain number of summer hours before aid can be awarded. Also, using financial aid during the summer terms can reduce the amount of aid you have available for the fall and spring semesters. Financial aid is not automatically awarded for summer. You must complete an online **Summer Aid Request Form** at [www.kent.edu/financialaid/summeraidrequest.cfm](http://www.kent.edu/financialaid/summeraidrequest.cfm) before aid can be awarded. But before doing so, know how your future aid will be affected by meeting with a financial aid specialist before requesting financial aid for summer.

### Your Work Schedule, Vacations and Other Obligations

Because summer courses are more accelerated, your attendance in class needs to be a top priority. If you will be missing several class meetings, summer courses may not be right for you. Listed below are Stark summer session dates:

# NEW STUDENT GUIDE

## 1 ADMISSIONS

### Applying for Admission

Apply online starting with “Steps to Apply” at [www.stark.kent.edu/admissions](http://www.stark.kent.edu/admissions) and submit the nonrefundable \$30 application fee.

**Note:** If you already have an application on file at the Kent Campus or another Regional Campus, you do not need to complete another application. Contact the Office of Admissions at Kent State Stark to change your campus.

### Guest Students

Guest students from other institutions taking courses at Kent State Stark for the summer only should see page 4 for new guest student information.

### First Year Student Requirements

- Official high school transcript.
- GED holders must bring original GED score report to office to be copied.
- ACT or SAT scores (if under the age of 21).

### Transfer Student Requirements

- Official transcripts from **ALL** previously attended institutions.
- Official high school transcripts (if less than 12 college semester hours completed).
- ACT or SAT scores (if under the age of 21 and less than 12 college semester hours completed).

### Postundergraduate Student Requirements

- Non-degree seekers: Official transcript from where bachelor degree was earned.
- Degree-seekers: Official transcripts from **ALL** previously attended institutions.

### Graduate Student Application

- All graduate students must apply at [www.kent.edu/admissions/apply/graduate](http://www.kent.edu/admissions/apply/graduate).

After receiving the above, Kent State Stark will send written notification of acceptance, usually within two weeks.

## 2 TESTING

Placement testing takes place in the Academic Success Center, located in the lower level of the Campus Center.

All new students are required to take the online ALEKS mathematics placement assessment. If students have current ACT scores, reading and writing placements will be determined by the appropriate ACT subscores.

If students do not have current ACT scores, students must take the reading and writing parts of the computerized COMPASS placement test.

Test results are used by academic advisors to help determine proper course selections. Transfer students should contact the Office of Student Services to determine the necessity of placement testing.

- Before testing in the Center, you must show a photo ID.
- ALEKS and COMPASS testing are free.
- **ALEKS can be taken online from home** through FlashLine > Student Tools & Courses > Placement Assessment > Math Placement. ALEKS may also be taken at the Academic Success Center if a student chooses.
- COMPASS testing is proctored in the Academic Success Center.
- Average testing time for COMPASS Writing and Reading is one hour. ALEKS testing time averages 90 minutes. You test at your own pace.
- Arrive at least two hours prior to the Center closing to allow enough time for testing.
- No appointment is necessary for placement testing.

Students must complete ALEKS testing and COMPASS testing when necessary prior to their academic advising appointment.

## 3 ADVISING

Before meeting with an academic advisor, students must be admitted and have taken any required placement tests.

### Advising Appointments

Schedule a convenient half-hour academic advising appointment at [www.stark.kent.edu/academics/advising](http://www.stark.kent.edu/academics/advising) or contact the Office of Student Services at 330-244-3251. An advisor will discuss placement, advise if additional preparation is needed, briefly discuss majors and help select appropriate classes.

### Walk-In Advising

Students can meet with an advisor without an appointment on designated walk-in advising dates. **Students must be admitted and have completed any required placement tests before participating in walk-in advising.** View walk-in advising dates at [www.stark.kent.edu/academics/advising](http://www.stark.kent.edu/academics/advising).

## 4 REGISTRATION

It is recommended that students register early for best availability. Registration for all summer terms begins Feb. 20 for all students. Registration is done through FlashFAST in FlashLine > Student Tools & Courses. See page 3 for registration dates.

## 5 STUDENT ID

### Kent State FLASHCard

The Kent State FLASHCard is more than just a student ID. FLASHCards can be used as debit accounts to purchase books, supplies and clothing in the Bookstore or purchase food in the Emporium. It is required to check out materials from the Library, pay for printing in the computer labs and to use the Fitness Center.

Get your FLASHCard in the Office of Student Services. A current photo ID such as a driver's license or state issued ID is required to issue a FLASHCard.

Students can add money (cash or check) to their FLASHCards at [www.kent.edu/flashcard](http://www.kent.edu/flashcard) or by stopping in the Office of Student Services.

## QUESTIONS?

If you have questions and would like to talk to someone before applying for admission to Kent State Stark, the Office of Admissions offers pre-admission appointments.

## GUEST STUDENT GUIDE

### A guest student may be defined as either:

- A student pursuing a degree at another institution yet wishes to take courses at Kent State University.
- A student who would like to take a limited number of undergraduate courses for credit. In order to apply as a guest, students must have graduated from high school or obtained a GED certificate or the equivalent. Guest students can only enroll in 18 semester hours. Students cannot receive financial aid or earn a degree in this admission status.

### Course Scheduling

After being admitted, students will receive FlashLine login information in the mail. All class registration will be online using FlashFAST, accessible via FlashLine > Student Tools & Courses.

Registration for all summer terms begins Feb. 20. See page 3 for registration dates.

### Course Prerequisites and Testing

After attempting registration, guest students may find that they are unable to register for a course because they have not met the Kent State prerequisite requirement. In this instance, students should contact an academic advisor at 330-244-3251. Students may be asked to do the following, depending on their individual situation:

- Provide a college transcript and course description to show that the prerequisite course was taken.
- Complete ALEKS or COMPASS testing to determine placement in a class.

### Academic Advising

Guest students are strongly encouraged to seek academic advising from their present college to know which Kent State courses satisfy major requirements. Although academic advising is not required before course registration, an advisor can help determine if course prerequisites have been met. ### Walk-In Advising

## CLASS CANCELLATION DUE TO NONPAYMENT

Payments processed on May 10-11 will result in a \$30 late fee. Non-payment of a student's schedule may result in cancellation. Schedule cancellations for non-payment will be processed on May 11 and June 5. Students will be notified via their university email address if their schedule is canceled.

**Do not assume that not paying for classes will cause your schedule to be canceled.**

# COURSE WITHDRAWAL, REFUNDS & FINANCIAL AID

## TUITION PAYMENT METHODS

The Office of Student Services accepts cash, money orders and personal checks for payments of fees. Credit card payments must be done online. MasterCard, American Express, Diners Club and Discover are the only credit cards accepted. **Visa is not accepted.** A convenience fee of 2.9% will be charged to all credit card payments. Check payments can also be made online.

1. Students may make payments online through a secure website at <https://payonline.kent.edu>. There is an authorized user and pin-less user option for parents who are making payments. Checks can also be processed online at no cost using this option.

Include the student's full name and student's ID number on the check. **Mailed payments should be at the Post Office no less than seven business days before the due date.**
3. Check and cash payments may be made in person in the Office of Student Services during regular office hours.

## COURSE WITHDRAWAL & TUITION CREDIT

Students who withdraw from all classes or drop courses may be entitled to a tuition adjustment. Refund and withdrawal dates for courses can be viewed by clicking on the CRN of each course in FlashLine > Student Tools & Courses > Print Student Schedule. Dates can also be viewed at [www.stark.kent.edu](http://www.stark.kent.edu) > Class Schedule Search (button) > Select Term > Detailed Class Search > Registration Deadlines.

Students are considered withdrawn as of the date the withdrawal is completed in FlashFAST. Withdrawal notices sent to any other university office are not valid. Students who have not paid registration fees and fail to withdraw from the university will continue to be liable for the fees assessed.

It is strongly encouraged that students discuss academic progress with their professors prior to course withdrawal. Also speak with an academic advisor prior to withdrawing to make sure the effects of dropping classes are understood. If students are receiving any form of financial aid, loans included, they should speak with a member of the financial aid staff before dropping a course. Not attending a course does not constitute withdrawing from a course at Kent State. ## RETURN OF TITLE IV FUNDS & WITHDRAWAL RECORD

The Department of Education in CFR34 Part 668 Federal Refund Policy provides the guidelines for computing refunds for students who withdraw from all classes during a semester. Students who withdraw completely from the university and have received Title IV funds may be liable for repayment of funds to the University. ## REFUNDS

Each student attending Kent State will be mailed a KSU Choice Card shortly after they register for classes the first time. Students must log into [KSUChoiceCard.com](http://KSUChoiceCard.com) when they receive their card to select the method in which any future refunds will be issued to them. Failure to make a refund selection will delay the delivery of a refund. Students must select one of the three refund preferences below for their student refunds:

- Direct deposit into the student's bank account
- Paper check
- OneAccount

## FINANCIAL AID

## SUMMER FINANCIAL AID

Using grants, loans or work-study during the summer may affect how much financial aid students have available for fall and/or spring. Before applying for summer aid, students may want to speak with a member of the financial aid staff to see how their future aid may be affected.

Guest students interested in using aid for the summer must contact their home institution for financial aid processing and awarding. Kent State does not process financial aid for guest students.

## HOW TO APPLY FOR SUMMER FINANCIAL AID

1. You must be registered for summer classes before a summer aid request can be processed by the Financial Aid Office.
2. File a 2012-2013 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov).
3. Complete the online summer aid request form at [www.kent.edu/financialaid/summeraidrequest.cfm](http://www.kent.edu/financialaid/summeraidrequest.cfm). The last date to complete the online summer request form is July 31.
4. Students selected for verification or academic progress will not have their summer request form processed until the verification or appeal process is completed.
5. Summer aid will not transfer to a student's account until they are in compliance with the Academic Progress Policy and all other federal, state and institutional requirements are met. Check the status of your summer aid request in FlashLine.

Summer aid will be disbursed on May 26 for Intersession, SummerFlex, Full Term, Summer I and Summer II. Summer aid will be disbursed on June 29 for those enrolled in Summer III only.

## FIXED ENROLLMENT DATES FOR FINANCIAL AID RECIPIENTS

Your final financial aid award is based on the number of credit hours for which you are enrolled at the end of the 100% credit period for each class. You should drop or add any classes prior to this date in order to receive a financial aid award that corresponds with your enrollment status. If you change your schedule after the applicable date, you risk having your financial aid adjusted or canceled.

## STANDARDS OF SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS POLICY

Federal regulations require that Kent State University review the academic progress of students who apply for and/or receive federal financial aid, whether they are a previous aid recipient or not. # HOW TO REGISTER FOR CLASSES & ACADEMIC ADVISING

## REGISTERING FOR CLASSES & SCHEDULE ADJUSTMENTS

All registration and schedule adjustments are done through FlashFAST in FlashLine > Student Tools & Courses. Review the schedule adjustment timetable at [www.kent.edu/registrar/calendars](http://www.kent.edu/registrar/calendars).

- Click FlashLine Login on any Kent State homepage. Enter your FlashLine user name and password.
- Click on Student Tools & Courses.
- Access registration options from Registration Tools by clicking on one of these options:

### ► LOOK UP AND REGISTER FOR CLASSES

- This method is best if you do not know the CRN (course reference number) and need to search for specific classes.
- Select the term.

#### SEARCH TIPS:

- You must select at least one subject.
- To select all subject areas, hold down the SHIFT key and click on the first entry and the last entry.
- To select multiples, hold down the CONTROL key and click on the subject areas you want to browse.
- Select Campus for location of the course (may choose multiple campuses).
- **Search Instructional Method for Online Classes:**
  - 100% Online.
  - 100% Online-Set Meeting Times: Course will require one or more web-based scheduled class meetings.
  - Partially Online: Course is at least 50% web-based and will require one or more face to face class meetings at a KSU location.
- **Search by Attribute Type to find the following:**
  - Kent Core Courses
  - Diversity Courses
  - Honors Courses
  - Writing Intensive Courses
- **Search by Course Number to find Upper Division Courses:**
  - Enter a 3 for 30000-level upper division courses
  - Enter a 4 for 40000-level upper division courses

- If class is available, there will be an empty check box next to the CRN.
- Place a check in the box and click Register.
- To view additional information about a course such as prerequisites, descriptions and instructor information, click on the blue highlighted CRN number. To view prerequisites, select view catalog entry.

### ► ADD OR DROP CLASSES

- This method is best if you know the CRN (course reference number).
  - Acknowledge & Accept the Add/Drop Classes Tuition Assessment Policy.
  - Select the term.
  - Enter the CRN on the Add Classes Worksheet.
  - Click Submit Changes.

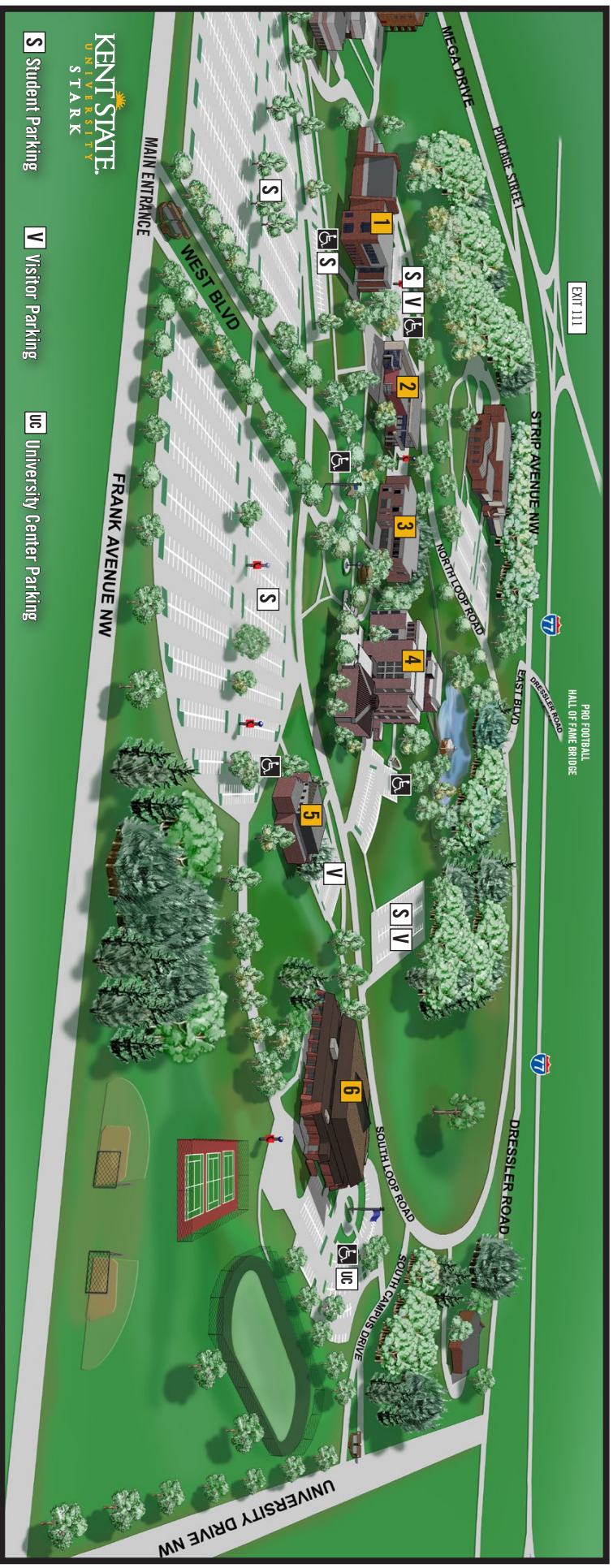
